

FINAL REPORT - Project 99p4 AKTION Österreich - Tschechische Republik Study Exchange: Intercultural Project in Social Economy

The student exchange took place from 3th to 12st November 2024. Six Czech students of Master's degree in Social Work from Ostrava made a study trip to Vienna (FH Campus Wien) and six Austrian students of Master's degree in Social Economy and Social Work from Vienna made a study trip to Ostrava (University of Ostrava/Faculty of Social Studies).

This exchange aimed to deepen their knowledge and to acquire new competencies in project management and management of social organizations. Excursion extended their theoretical knowledge about the current situation of social policy in Austria, in the Czech Republic and the European Union. Students were offered diverse scientific research experiences in social economy and social work. They also got practical experiences of Austrian and Czech experts from social organizations. Finally, students learned about daily activities of selected social organizations (according to theirs preferences). Students brought knowledge of their own country and compared it with the host institution which triggered a productive learning circle.

Students prepared detailed questions for organizations prior to arrival to the host country and prepared selected readings in advance related to social policy and project management. In the host country students were offered a programme consisting of lectures, discussions and organisation visits. Evaluations have shown a high level of satisfaction with the programme. As one of the most important learnings students reported the chance to get in closer contact with neighbouring countries and to learn from each other.

#### The final report

In 3.-12.11.2024 we welcomed 6 students from Austria who came to Ostrava because the project 99p4 on which University of Ostrava, Faculty of Social Sciences has been cooperated with FH Campus Wien. Intercultural Project in Social Economy is part of Joint Degree – European master study programme of Social work and social economy of the University of Ostrava along with Austrian FH Campus Wien (and also other universities are joined). Austrian students have been prepared to study field excursions. The main language of the excursions were English and students were also offered translation from Czech to English during the excursions.

During the staying in Ostrava students had possibility to attend these lectures:

- Presentation of the structure of project application, a short look at the possible sources of funding from the ESFI in the programming period 2021 2027 in the Czech Republic
- Risk Management Process in Project Planning
- Current development of social policy in the Czech Republic + discussion

Within the excursion in organization students could visit these organization:

- Domov Hortenzie Frenštát pod Radhoštěm
- Sociálně aktivizační služba BRÁNA
- Asociace TRIGON, o.p.s.

In addition to students from Austria students from Hungary, Ukraine, Brazil, the Republic of Korea and China participated in the programm. These students studied in Ostrava within the framework of the Erasmus program. In response to the excursion, the students developed a project proposal in a small team in partnership with three selected project organizations. The students received support from the supervisors: Mgr. Šárka Kopřivová, Ph.D. The chair was Mgr. Anna Musialová, Ph.D., Mgr. Karel Pavlica, Ph.D. a scholarship at the Faculty of Social Studies. Students of the Master's degree program in Social Work also participated in the project, who not only participated in the preparation of the program, but mainly accompanied foreign students to individual organizations.

The last day the project proposals of students were presented in small group of students, teachers and representatives of organization.

Besides overall evaluation was made - students wrote us how they evaluate excursions, lectures and organization of field excursion and they added theirs recommendations for the next years. At the end of the educational exchange, the students were asked to process the results of the team group as a final report, which will include an assessment of the project proposal. This report will be assessed by the University of Ostrava and students will receive feedback on their project proposal. Because the project students could experience how bilateral cooperation works in practice and they showed us great interest to attend cross-border projects also in the future.

We think it was a very important experience to get to know welfare system and organization of social work in neighboring state and its specific problems in social area.

That is why we would like to thank you very much for the opportunity to realize this project and we hope that final report and the project billing will be correct.
