## Final report: Aktion project No. 89p21

## Parallels and differences: Political journalism cultures in the Czech Republic and Austria

This project aimed to explore the varying political pressures – both new and old – which influence journalism in Austria and the Czech Republic, with the key aim of developing a funding application for a larger, cross-national project comparing political journalism cultures in Austria and the Czech Republic.

Although the project was based on travel and physical meetings of the team, we managed to achieve the planned goal of drafting a joint project, even though most of the activities took place online. We were able to learn more about each other's expertise, collaborate on the drafting of the project documents, and set up mutual collaboration for the future. Thus, even though most of the allocated funds were not used, all project objectives were achieved.

The main output of the project is a draft application for a "Lead Agency" grant (see <a href="https://gacr.cz/en/overview/evaluation-based-on-the-lead-agency-principle-la-projects/">https://gacr.cz/en/overview/evaluation-based-on-the-lead-agency-principle-la-projects/</a>) from the countries' respective national research foundations, FWF and GAČR. The team continues to collaborate and refine the project so that it can be submitted in April 2022.




